Reading Progress: Start to Finish



Urgent Intervention

• BOY: 48% ▶ EOY: 40% — Fewer students are in need of urgent help!

Intervention Needed

BOY: 20% ➡ EOY: 13% — Fewer students need this level of support.

On Watch

BOY: 20% → EOY: 21% — Holding steady and ready to grow.

At or Above Benchmark

 BOY: 12% ➡ EOY: 25% — More than doubled the number of students reading on grade level!

What This Means:

- More students are on track with reading than when we started.
- We're closing gaps and lifting more scholars out of urgent reading levels.
- Every gain is a step closer to academic success—and we're just getting started!

What is ACT 422?

Louisiana's Act 422 (2023) focuses on ensuring students are reading on grade level before entering 4th grade.



Under this law:

- 3rd grade students who score at the lowest level on the state literacy screener may not be promoted to 4th grade unless they qualify for an exemption.
- Schools are required to:
 - Identify students reading below grade level,
 - Create a Reading Improvement Plan, and
 - Provide intensive support and interventions to help students catch up.

What This Means for Families:


- We're committed to early identification and strong support.

- Retention is not automatic—our goal is to help every student succeed with the support they need.









How You Can Help:

- Stay connected Join school events, parent-teacher meetings, and stay in touch with teachers.













BEFORE & AFTER CARE



- Before Care Drop-off: 6:30–7:30 AM via Walmsley
 Door
- After Care Pick-up: 3:15–6:00 PM via Walmsley Door
- Adult must sign student in/out in person
- Only individuals on authorized pickup list may retrieve student
- Late pickups may result in additional fees








ARRIVAL + DISMISSAL Car Riders



Morning Arrival (7:30–8:00 AM):

- Use the carpool lane at Walmsley & Short Street
- Pull forward, drop off from passenger side only
- Students must be ready to exit quickly and independently



 After 8:00 AM: Enter through Carrollton entrance and be <u>signed in by an adult</u>








Afternoon Dismissal (3:15 PM):

- Display Carpool Name Plate in dashboard
- Remain in vehicle; staff will escort students
- Walker Door is **NOT** to be used for car rider pickup








ARRIVAL + DISMISSAL Bus Riders



Arrival:

Students are

- Supervised and escorted from buses by staff
- Enter through Walmsley Door
- Go directly to breakfast in cafeteria



Dismissal:

Students are:

- Supervised and escorted to buses by staff
- Must follow all bus safety rules





ARRIVAL + DISMISSAL Walkers (Families NOT using Carpool)




Arrival:

- Students enter through Short Gate (7:30–8:00 AM only)
- After 8:00 AM: Use Carrollton entrance and sign-in required


Dismissal:

- Must be registered walkers with visible Walker Tag
- Dismissed through Short Gate under staff supervision
- Adults picking up must have the tag


- Use corner crosswalk or cross street with crossing guard
- No mid-street pickups or unauthorized curbside parking








ATTENDANCE Every Day, Every Minute Counts!



Why attendance matters:

- Students must attend at least 167 days to move to the next grade.
- Missing just 2 days a month adds up to over 17 days a year worth of loss instruction.
- Students learn best when they're in class every day, on time.

What counts as an absence?

- Excused: illness, family emergency, religious holiday (with a note)
- Unexcused: no note, travel, oversleeping, staying home without cause

Keep us informed! Send a note or contact the offce when your child will be absent.

ATTENDANCE Make-up Seat Time (Must)



Make Up Seat time is required by the state law for 10+ Unexcused Absences

- Louisiana law says students must make up learning time if they miss too many unexcused days.
- Once a student reaches 10 unexcused absences, they must complete Make-Up Seat Time (MUST) to meet state requirements.

PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD IS PRESENT AND ON TIME DAILY!



ATTENDANCE Being On Time Matters Too!




- School starts at 8:00 AM students must be in class and ready to learn!
- Tardy = arriving after 8:00 AM (must sign in at the front office)
- Repeated tardies/early pick ups can lead to missed learning and may count toward truancy

Reminder: No early pickups after 2:00 PM

Kindergarten is now mandatory in Louisiana, and all attendance rules—including required days and Make-Up Seat Time—apply to kindergarten students too.





1.	Bus routes are available for students today!!!





At The Leah Chase School:

We teach behavior like we teach reading—through guidance, practice, and support. We use:


PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports)


- Celebrate good choices with praise, shout-outs, and rewards


DisciPline at The Leah Chase School




At TLC, discipline means guiding students to make better choices—not just handing out consequences.

We use a tiered approach:

- Minor issues are handled with redirection, reset conversations, and reflection.
- Repeated or serious behaviors may involve loss of privileges, parent contact, or behavior plans.
- All major incidents are documented and handled according to the NOLA-PS Code of Conduct.





What We Don't Allow



To keep our school safe and focused:

- No bullying, threats, or unsafe behavior
- No phones or smart devices during school hours Devices are collected each morning and returned at dismissal
- No fighting or destruction of property These are serious and result in administrative follow-up










SUPPORTS FOR DIVERSE LEARNERS

- Christina Leslie School Counselor: Reach out if your child needs socialemotional support, behavior concerns, or someone to talk to.








Dr. Serena Walker-Netter – Social Worker: Contact her for support with mental health, family challenges, or help connecting to community resources.

School Nurse - Reach out if your child has any health concerns or needs that need to be supported at school.






CORE CURRICULUM

These curricula were chosen for their alignment with state and district standards, comprehensive subject coverage, and engagement relevance.








ENRIGHMENT/ EXPLORATORY CLASSES




- Physical Education: Promoting physical fitness, teamwork, and healthy lifestyles.

- Spanish: Introducing students to the Spanish language and culture, enhancing their global awareness and communication skills.











CELL PHONE POLICY



Socks should be plain without any writing or logos.


Outerwear

2025-26 CHOOL SUPPLIES




ALL supplies for scholars will be provided by the school for the 2025-26 school year. Supplies for each child will be shipped directly to the school.

Supply lists for the 26-27 school year will be sent home at the end of this year!







1:1 Tech Device


Meals at School


VISITOR GUIDELINES


