During the evening, families will:

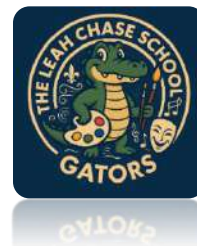
- Learn about our schoolwide literacy plan and progress toward literacy goals

### UNIFORM REFERRAL PROGRAM

## MIDDLE OF YEAR TESTING

### DIAGNOSTIC TESTING (READING & MATH PROGRESS SKILLS ARE MONITORED)

- January 12-16<sup>th</sup>: Grades K-6

The i-Ready Diagnostic Assessment is used to understand *where each student is academically and what they need next*. Its purpose goes beyond assigning a score, it guides instruction and support.

### Key reasons for administering the i-Ready Diagnostic:

- Identify individual student needs:** It pinpoints specific skills students have mastered and areas where they need support in reading and math.
- Measure growth over time:** When given multiple times a year, it shows how much progress students make from one diagnostic window to the next.
- Inform instruction:** Teachers use the data to plan targeted lessons, small groups, interventions, and differentiation during core instruction.
- Guide intervention and enrichment:** Results help determine which students need additional support and which are ready for accelerated or enrichment opportunities.
- Support goal setting:** Students and teachers can set academic goals based on diagnostic results and monitor progress toward those goals.
- Ensure equitable instruction:** The diagnostic helps schools ensure all students receive instruction aligned to their current learning level.

## TECH DESK- IMPORTANT UPDATES

Dear Parents,

Louisiana law now makes it illegal to create, share, or possess digitally altered or AI-generated images of another person in an indecent or harmful manner without that person's consent. This includes images that falsely depict someone in a state of undress or compromising situations, even if the image was created as a joke or using artificial intelligence. These actions can carry serious legal consequences, particularly when minors are involved. We encourage families to talk with students about respect, consent, and responsible technology use, and to remind them that online actions, especially those involving images of others, can have lasting real-world impacts.

## MENTAL HEALTH MATTERS

As we begin the new year, students are developing important social and emotional skills through **Second Step Unit 4: Problem-Solving**. These lessons support students in learning how to calm down, think through challenges, and make safe, kind choices at school and at home. Students are practicing skills such as understanding their feelings, managing strong emotions, seeing others' perspectives, getting along with peers, and thinking ahead before making decisions.

Families can support this learning by talking through everyday problems, encouraging children to name their feelings, practicing calming strategies like deep breathing, asking reflective questions, and praising positive problem-solving behaviors.
